Food Share cart launched at Chariho High School (January '24)

Has diverted over 2,400 pieces of hand fruit for hungry/food insecure students


Shift from styrofoam to reusable trays at CHS and CMS (December '24)

Reduced landfill waste by volume from 19 bags to 9 bags (53% decrease)

Shift to food waste diversion at CHS (February '24)

- Reduced landfill waste by volume from 9 bags to 2 bags (78% decrease)
- Overall landfill waste by volume decreased 89% from December '24 to February '25


