Many of our food donation recipients share similar stories, where ensuring food security is a constant challenge and wasting food is never an option. Driven by his commitment to combat hunger and reduce wasted food, Robert founded RLC in 2013.

We are dedicated to combatting food insecurity and wasted food by rescuing surplus food and redistributing it to communities who need it most




The Food Waste Crisis

We also divert excess food from large events and gatherings to local communities within our local branches, collaborating with event organizers, venues, conferences, sports arenas, concerts, and food service providers.

2014-2015

Early Growth

- Enhanced food recovery solutions via collaboration with Blue Ridge Labs social innovation incubator
- Developed proprietary tech platform to modernize food rescue operations
- Forged large-scale donation partnerships with KIND Snacks and Frito-Lay to amplify impact

2017-2019

National Expansion

- Achieved milestone of 1M+ pounds of food rescued in 2018
- Broadened our impact with new branches in Columbus, Atlanta, and Dallas
- Waitlist of food donors established, signaling growing demand for services

2022-2023

Scaling Services

- 2.9M+ pounds of food rescued in 2022
- Launched nationwide large-scale pallet donation services
- Opened Chicago and Los Angeles branches
